Our Schools

I know that this is the December edition of the CIA, but I want to start with what I am thankful for. I am thankful for our staff who continue to work together to focus on student learning. I am thankful for staff who encourage students to “own” their learning. In those efforts, we are seeing students take charge of different activities. At the high school, our Associated Student Body is leading discussions with classmates around the importance of attendance and study habits to be successful.

This year we brought back a district-wide Veteran’s Day assembly. Topic of the Month: The Importance of a General Fund Balance

In writing a budget, we try very hard to forecast the amount of funding we will receive from state, federal, and local sources. None of these funds come in one payment at the beginning of a school year. State funds come in five payments spread throughout the school year with different amounts each time. We get an estimated allocation from the federal government, but the funds come to us through a reimbursement process. Our local levy funds don't begin to be

disbursed until after the school year begins, and not in one lump sum. This is why a fund balance is so important. That fund balance is used to pay bills before we begin getting payments from state or local sources. Our monthly expenses average a little more than \$600,000. Auditors and Finance Specialists at the Idaho Department of Education suggest that a district have at least three months' worth of expenses in its fund balance. Why? So bills can get paid even when state and local revenues have not been disbursed to districts.

The November Coffee with the Superintendent at the Ag Shop was so successful, we decided to do something similar for December. Board Member Jessica Schofield will join me Dec. 6 at 7:30 a.m. at Potlatch Elementary. We will be meeting in the Upper Lounge of the school, near the cafeteria. We look forward to seeing you there!

Palouse Habitat for Humanity receives a \$25,000 grant

The U.S. Bank Foundation has awarded a \$25,000 *Community Possible* grant to Palouse Habitat for Humanity to support Habitat's work building affordable homes around the Palouse region.

The grant will provide operation support this coming year while Palouse HFH finishes the Jones family home in Palouse, the Austin family home in Moscow, and starts the 2025 home in Pullman.

From the U.S. Bank Foundation website: "In Latah and Whitman Counties, the median income earner can no longer afford the median home price," noted Jennifer Wallace, Executive Director of Palouse HFH. "More and more of our neighbors are spending over a third of their income on housing, putting them in a precarious situation where they may not have enough to cover the costs of food, health care, transportation, childcare, and other basic needs, or an unforeseen emergency. Palouse Habitat is working hard to be part of the solution and build more affordable homes."
